

A 1940S MUSICAL REVUE

Boogie Woogie Babies TOM HAGEN STUDIO

The Boogie Woogie Babies are all about

the vocals. The title of their new CD is A 1940s Musical Revue and the vocals are right where they belong: front and center. From the opening



harmonies of "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy" to the closing "Lullaby of Broadway Medley," it is obvious these Babies sing very well together.

There isn't much in the way of other instruments between these voices and listening ears. Mark Kahny is a talented piano player and he does a fine job of supporting the three Babies. I was fortunate enough to hear Kahny and the crew perform on the Lowell Showboat earlier this year and their collective talent impressed me then along with the rest of the appreciative audience.

Francesca Amari, Mary Rademacher, and Barbara Wisse bring a wealth of diverse singing experience to the music. Their backgrounds include everything from hammering out jingles and musical theater to the subtleties of jazz vocals and everything in between. Their flexibility serves them well on the CD and the fact that they have been singing together for nearly a decade is very evident—especially in the short (too short, ladies) a cappella version of "America" and

the beginning of "I'll Be Seeing You."

When the Babies perform live, their energy and smiles fairly force the audience to have a good time, and those smiles come across in their recorded performance as well. A tip of the hat to the Tom Hagen Studio in Saranac is probably due here. The project was recorded, mixed, and mastered there, and it sounds good on computer speakers as well as on a solid sound system.

Fans of composer/lyricist Johnny Mercer will be delighted. Five of his hits appear with four of them in a medley that includes favorites "Come Rain or Come Shine" and "Jeepers Creepers." Mercer's "P.S. I Love You" has Rademacher handling the lead, and she does it with flair. All three Babies have their time in the spotlight, but their ability to make harmonious melodies together is the standout feature. A

The History of the Boogie Woogie Babies,...

The **Boogie Woogie Babies** are a vocal trio comprised of three versatile, talented, entertaining and busy West Michigan vocalists, and accompanied by one of the area's finest pianists.

Boogie Woogie Babies was created in 1993 by singer/actress/director Francesca Amari as a one-night-only dinner theatre production at the American Legion Boat & Canoe Club in Grand Rapids, Michigan. The "show" was so well received that Amari expanded it and started booking the 2-act theatrical revue throughout West Michigan. In the original Boogie Woogie Babies - a 1940s Musical Revue, Amari incorporated dialogue, historical information, trivia, skits and favorite songs from the WWII era, including many made famous by the fabulous Andrews Sisters. In

order to create an evening that is true to the history books, **Amari** has sought out 1940s-period military uniforms and artifacts for set decoration and costumes for the performers. In addition, all information incorporated into the theatrical revue is based on actual historical events, including letters to and from WWII GIs and newspaper accounts of Pearl Harbor. This show receives standing ovations wherever it is presented and the **Boogie Woogie Babies** have enjoyed a growing, avid fan base because of their tight harmonies and entertaining presentation.

In 2000, the Boogie Woogie Babies became a member of the prestigious Michigan Humanities Council Touring Artist Roster (www.michiganhumanities.org), as well as the Heartland Arts Fund Artist Roster (Arts Midwest), and is now invited to perform throughout the Midwest. In August, 2006, the MI Humanities Council announced the adjudicated members of its newest roster (2006-2009), and the Boogie Woogie Babies were once again on the prestigious list. Nonprofit groups that book artists from the Roster are eligible for grants from the Council. This is the third Directory to include this popular West Michigan trio.

Because of the group's popularity, **Amari** has also created two other high-energy, entertaining musical revues for the group, **Boogie Woogie Babies** - **Boogie Down Broadway**, and **Boogie**, **Beehives & Beyond.** Both shows featuring a myriad of popular and little known gems from their respective genres (Broadway and off-Broadway; and girl group history). The revues both made their debuts at the Legend Theatre in South Haven, MI to standing room only crowds and the audiences were wowed by the variety of music included in both shows and the depth of the performances by the versatile vocalists.

The **Boogie Woogie Babies** has a self-titled CD, which features the songs from the 1940s, plus a bonus medley of Broadway songs. The group is currently working on its newest CD, which should be available in late 2006!






